



## REMEMBER A SOLDIER – BUY A BRICK



The citizen-soldiers who fought for the Confederacy personified the best qualities of America. The preservation of liberty and freedom was the motivating factor in the South's decision to fight the *Second American Revolution*. The tenacity with which Confederate soldiers fought underscored their belief in the rights guaranteed by the Constitution. These attributes are the underpinning of our democratic society and represent the foundation on which this nation was built.

Since 1939, the **Forrest – Streight Surrender Site Monument** at Cedar Bluff, Alabama has stood as a memorial to these brave men and, a testament to the high regard and affection in which they were held by their sons and daughters, and by the grateful citizens of Alabama. The monument, erected by the United Daughters of the Confederacy, was given to the Sons of Confederate Veterans and improvements were made in 2006 and 2010.

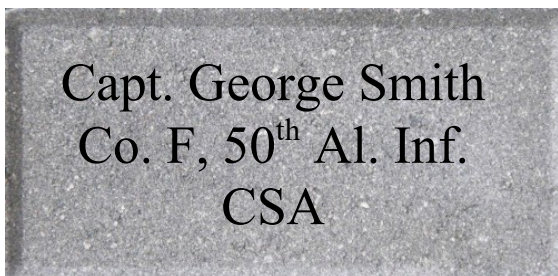
After 78 years, the SCV is asking the people of the South to honor our Confederate veterans by donating to the *Forrest - Streight Surrender Site project*. Project plans include landscaping, protective barriers and a walkway. As part of the memorial, commemorative bricks engraved with the name of a Confederate soldier will be embedded in a field of pavers within the landscaped area of the property.

If you have Confederate ancestors, or would like to honor a Confederate soldier who has no one else to remember him, please consider purchasing one, or more, of these commemorative bricks. The bricks are 4" x 8" and will be laser-engraved with the name of the soldier and his unit. We will engrave and install the bricks at the monument for a donation of **\$30 per brick**. Any profits from brick sales will be used in the renovation of the monument. **We have space for only 135 bricks in phase 1.**
